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2. They may have also experienced at least ONE of the following in the last year:
 □ Serious lung or kidney infection (pneumonia; pyelonephritis) □ Sepsis □ Severe open pressure ulcers (stage 3-4 decubiti) □ Persistent fever, even after antibiotics □ Weight loss of >10% in last 6 months or serum albumin <3.0gm/dl □ Recent hospitalization □ Mitchell Mortality Risk Indicator score ≥9 (See Appendix 4)

In the absence of one or more of the above findings, rapid decline or co-morbidities may also support eligibility for hospice care.

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
